ARP PECULIAR GALAXIES

The "Atlas of Peculiar Galaxies" is a catalog of peculiar galaxies produced by Dr. Halton C. Arp.

A total of 338 galaxies are presented in the atlas, which was originally published in 1966. Arp compiled this atlas with photographs from the Palomar 200-inch telescope.


The primary goal of the catalog was to present photographs of examples of the different kinds of peculiar structures found among nearby galaxies.

With this atlas, astronomers had a sample of peculiar galaxies that they could study in more detail.


The atlas does not present a complete overview of every peculiar galaxy in the sky, but instead provide examples of the different phenomena as observed in nearby galaxies.


ARP 1-101 SPIRAL GALAXIES










